Dec 7th Camp Wickliffe Larue Co Jan th9 1862 Dear Aunt as Mr Oglesby is down hear I thought I would drop you all afew lines to let you know how wee ar hear wee ar all well and fat and fine we ar incampt on Muldraughs hill sixfive miles from Louisville I donot know how long wee will stay hear but not long. I reckon wee incampt last mo monday night one mile up	6 th Regiment left Sigel on Dec 30 th for Camp Norton in Bardstown. At Camp Norton they met up with three other Indiana regiments and marched 21 miles south to Camp Wickliffe in Larue County. Despite Mount's description, others described the trek as long and tedious with bad weather. At Wickliffe, the regiments came under the command of Colonel William Hazer.
